More History from Joe Guy

Daphne was born in 1851, a slave in the Edwards home near Charleston, South Carolina. As a small child, she learned to help with the Edwards babies, and was taught to read by the Edwards children. At about age 9, Daphne was taken from her mother and brothers and sold to a family in Augusta, Georgia, then sold again and taken by train to Athens, Tennessee where she stood on a box at the Courthouse and was purchased by the Billy Peck family.

Daphne grew up a slave in the Peck household near Starr Mountain, learning the trade of a midwife, all the while keeping a small basket, the only connection to her long-lost mother and brothers in South Carolina. Daphne remained with the Pecks until the Civil War brought news of freedom in 1865.

Soon after, Daphne was released by the Pecks and taken to a farm nearby, where to her surprise, horror, and anger, she discovered her mother and brothers had been living the entire time as slaves. Reunited, the family made its own home away from the former owners who had deceived them and kept the family apart.

Daphne later married, and continued to be a nurse and midwife to both black and white families in the Beth Salem community. When Daphne Chestnutt Melton Howard died she was buried at Beth Salem Church, with her large and distinguished family mourning her.
