◆DISAGREEMENT OVER THE GEM THEATER

There seems to be a struggle taking place in Etowah over the use of the Historic Gem Theater. For years, the Gem Players have presented plays and other productions at the theater. Several times a year, the Merchants Association of Etowah presents profitmaking shows, usually featuring Elvis or other musical impersonators. The groups have managed to co-exist. But now, sources tell us that the mayor has changed the locks on the theater doors and is refusing to give a key to the Gem Players. The Etowah City Commission will meet next Monday, October 28th, at 6 p.m. at the Community Center to try to reach an agreement so both groups can continue to use the Gem Theater.

FIRE DESTROYS GIANT TREEHOUSE

A Crossville landmark has been destroyed by fire. The ten-story tall Minister's Treehouse burned to the ground Tuesday night. The huge treehouse stood over 90 feet tall and took over a decade to complete. Horace Burgess bought the land outside Crossville in the early 1990's. He became ordained as a minister and began working on the project because he felt God wanted him to build a treehouse. The structure became a popular destination for church groups and tourists alike. The Minister's Treehouse was closed as a tourist attraction by Fire Marshalls in 2012 due to the dilapidated condition of the structure. No injuries were reported in the fire and there has been no word on the cause.

WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities ended the day up slightly. The materials sector led the broad market, and the consumer discretionary sector lagged. Treasury prices declined. Interest rates rose.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 46 points or 0.2% to 26,834. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 9 points or 0.3% to 3,005, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 15 points or 0.2% to 8,120.

In Bond Markets, the 30-year Treasury yield closed higher at 2.25% and the 10-year Treasury yield finished higher at 1.77%. In Commodity Markets, the spot price of gold rose \$7.20 to \$1,494.70, and the price of crude oil rose \$1.35 to \$55.83.
