### Halloween Activities Downtown

The City of Athens and Main Street Athens will host Downtown Halloween from 5 to 7 p.m. this Thursday. It's a fun, free, and friendly way to celebrate. There will be activities and treats, including allergy-friendly treats. A costume contest will be held at 6 p.m. at Market Park Pavilion. Merchants will be handing out candy. The event is free and open to the public. Weather, of course, is a big concern at this point. In the event of cancellation, an announcement will be made by 6 p.m. Wednesday and will be published in Thursday's Morning Fax.

In Etowah, there will be a Street of Treats from 4 to 6 p.m. in Downtown Etowah on Halloween night. Local churches will be giving out treats on the Depot grounds.

Instruct children to stay on sidewalks and to cross only at corners or crosswalks. Walk, never run, from house to house or across the street.


