### **Rain Affects Halloween Events**

With the weather forecast still calling for rain, some Halloween events in the area are being cancelled or postponed. Others will go on as scheduled. Here is where things stand:

Athens - In spite of a little rain and chilly weather, Athens will proceed with hosting the Downtown Halloween activities on Thursday from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m. Dress up, wrap up and come downtown for activities, treats and a costume contest that starts at 6 p.m. at the Market Park Pavilion. Per Lisa Dotson, Director of Main Street Athens, some downtown businesses will be handing out candy, and there will be lots of treats throughout the streets!

Decatur - Decatur has decided to go ahead with their Downtown Halloween Night event which is from 6 to 8 p.m. Their feeling is the rain will be over by then.

**Englewood** - Englewood's block party will be held Saturday from 6 to 8 p.m. instead of Halloween night.

**Etowah** - The Merchants and Friends of Etowah will still have their Street of Treats. However, the Etowah Area Chamber of Commerce has cancelled its portion of the events. That means there will be no costume or scarecrow contests and churches will not be handing out candy on the L&N Depot grounds.
