◆ ARMSTRONG TURNS HIMSELF IN

Former Etowah Police Chief Eric Armstrong turned himself in to authorities Thursday morning. He was wanted on a domestic violence warrant for an incident last Sunday morning involving his girlfriend. He left the scene and had not been heard from until Thursday morning. Armstrong was released after posting a \$500 bond. He will appear in McMinn County General Sessions Court in March.

♦ BRYANT IS A FINALIST FOR JUDGE

Jerri Bryant, Chancellor for McMinn, Monroe, Bradley, and Polk

counties, is one of three finalists for a seat on the Eastern District of the state Court of Appeals. The Governor's Council for Judicial Appointments met earlier this week to consider 16 applicants for the vacancy. The Council forwarded three names to Governor Bill Lee; Chancellor Bryant, Kristi Davis (a Circuit Court Judge in Knoxville), and Thomas Wright (a Circuit Court Judge for Greene, Hamblen, Hancock, and Hawkins counties). 

THURSDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks ended the day lower as spread of coronavirus continue to impact markets. All sectors posted declines. Food-delivery startup Doordash Inc. filed with the SEC for an initial public offering. Treasury prices rose slightly. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 1191 points or 4.4% to 25,767. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 138 points or 4.4% to 2,979, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 414 points or 4.6% to 8,566.

TODAY IN HISTORY - FEBRUARY 28th

1844 - The newly-built U.S.S. Princeton exploded while cruising on the Potomac River with top government officials on board. When the ship fired one of its guns to demonstrate the latest in naval armament, the gun exploded, killing the U.S. Secretary of State and Secretary of Navy and several other people. President John Tyler narrowly escaped death.

1849 - The first shipload of gold-seekers arrived in San Francisco after a five-month journey from New York City.

1940 - Singer Joe South was born. His biggest hit was "Walk A Mile In My Shoes."
