

Coronavirus Update

The number of coronavirus cases in Tennessee now stands at 1,537. The death toll has reached seven. The number of cases in McMinn County is holding steady at three. Meigs County has one case. Monroe County now has three cases. There are eight cases in Loudon County and eight in Bradley County. The county with the highest number of cases is Shelby, with 313. No cases are reported in Polk and Rhea counties. The largest number of cases in Tennessee has occurred in the 21-30 age range, 380.

North Carolina Closes Borders

North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper has ordered a statewide "Stay Away At Home" order effective on Monday. The order directs residents to stay at home unless they need to leave for essentials. As a result, the Cherohala Skyway between Tellico Plains and Robbinsville, NC, is blocked at the state line.



- The Athens Ministerial Association has decided to cancel the Midday Holy Week Services planned for the noon hour in different churches the week of April 6-10. The Easter Sunrise Service at Market Park Pavilion is also canceled.
