

Friday's Coronavirus Update

Tennessee has had 21,679 cases of COVID-19, with 14,632 patients recovered and 356 deaths. McMinn County reports 136 cases with 96 recovered and 14 deaths. Rhea County shows 198 cases, with 15 recovered. Meigs County reports 26 cases, with 21 recovered. Monroe County's total is 61 with 44 recovered and 1 death. Bradley County has 108 cases, 84 recovered, and 1 death. Polk County reports 15 cases with 13 recovered.

Starr Regional Eases Visitor Restrictions

Starr Regional Medical Center announces it is transitioning from a zero-visitor protocol to limited visitor restrictions at its Athens facility as the hospital gradually resumes elective and non -urgent cases and services. The decision was made after careful review of state and federal guidance. The updated restrictions will now allow most inpatients to have one visitor or support person per day.

Chief Executive Officer John McLain says the hospital's top priority is safeguarding the health and wellbeing of patients, providers, employees, and the community. McLain says they continue to monitor closely the prevalence of the COVID-19 virus in the community and feel confident that it is safe to begin allowing limited visitors again.

Under the updated restrictions, inpatients will be limited to one well visitor per day, including one support person for surgical and obstetric patients. All pediatric patients will be accompanied by a parent or guardian. All visitors must be 16 years or older, will be screened upon entry, and are required to wear a mask and an armband while in the facility. Visitors who do not pass the screening at entry will be asked to reschedule their visit until they are symptom-free. Visitors are not allowed for high-risk, isolation, immunocompromised, or patients who are under observation or test positive for COVID-19. Starr Regional continues to screen anyone who enters the facility for COVID-19 symptoms.

NEW GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS

Governor Lee's Economic Recovery Group has issued new guidelines for noncontact sports and camps. Noncontact sports may resume under certain precautions, including efforts to maintain social distancing, wear masks when feasible, and added sanitization measures. Sports that may return are baseball, softball, volleyball, golf, tennis, cycling, track and field, and equestrian. Contact sports such as football, wrestling, and hockey are not permitted except for practicing in a manner that does not involve close physical contact with other persons.

May 29, the 150th day of 2020. There are 216 days left in the year.

1736 - American patriot Patrick Henry was born. He urged the colony of Virginia to prepare to fight against England shortly before the Revolutionary War began. He made the famous statement, "Give me liberty or give me death!" **1790** - Rhode Island became the last of the original 13 states to ratify the Constitution.

1765 - Patrick Henry denounced the Stamp Act before Virginia's House of Burgesses.

1790 - Rhode Island became the 13th original colony to ratify the United States Constitution.

- 1848 Wisconsin became the 30th state of the union.
- 1903 Comedian and actor Bob Hope was born in England.
- **1917 -** President John F. Kennedy was born.

1942 - The biggest-selling record of all time was recorded on this date; Bing Crosby's White Christmas **1953** - Sir Edmund Hillary of New Zealand and his Sherpa guide became the first men to reach the top of Mount Everest, 29,020 feet above sea level.
