Green Light For School Project

Both the Athens City Council and the Athens City School Board have given unanimous approval to fund and build Phase I and Phase II of the school building project simultaneously. Phase I includes a new Pre-K to 2nd grade Elementary School and Phase II includes a new intermediate school for 3rd-5th grade. They will be built on the current campus of City Park School. The two schools are designed as two schools under one roof. Construction has already started and is expected to be completed by Fall of 2023. The Athens City Council approved the project at a called meeting Tuesday afternoon. The Athens City School Board gave its approval at a called meeting Wednesday morning.

COVID VACCINATION UPDATE

Tennessee Health Commissioner Dr. Lisa Piercey says it will take most of February to vaccinate everyone age 70 and over. She says there are about 300,000 people age 70 to 74 in the state. She says those 65 and older will be next on the vaccination list, along with teachers. Dr. Piercey says she is aware there is pressure to speed up the schedule to also immunize teachers in Tennessee, a process she expects could start happening by March or April. Piercey says supply remains the state's chief challenge. She says demand is very, very high. Dr. Piercey says there are some 5 million people eligible to get the COVID-19 vaccine in Tennessee, and so far some 800,000 people have actually gotten a dose. To schedule an appointment for a shot, eligible people can call 1-866-442-5301.

Big Expansion for Amazon

Governor Bill Lee has announced that Amazon will establish a new state-of-the-art fulfillment center in Alcoa. The site, expected to be operational in 2022, will create nearly 800 new full-time jobs with benefits and opportunities to engage with advanced robotics. Amazon employees will pick, pack, and ship smaller items from the facility. It will be Amazon's 8th fulfillment and sorting center in Tennessee. Amazon currently has facilities in Charleston, Chattanooga, Lebanon, Memphis, Murfreesboro, and Nashville. The company is also building a fulfillment center in Mt. Juliet. Since 2010, Amazon has invested nearly \$9 billion in Tennessee, including infrastructure and compensation to thousands of its employees in the state. Amazon estimates its investments in Tennessee have created an additional 12,700 indirect jobs on top of the company's direct


