## **COVID-19 Vaccination Update**

The Tennessee Department of Health reminds adults aged 70 and older they are now eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccination. TDH estimates there are about 300,000 Tennesseans in the 70-74 year age group, and only about one in three Tennesseans in this group have been vaccinated to date. The shots are now being given to those 70 and older in all counties. The TN Department of Health says people aged 70 to 74 have a 70 percent higher rate of death and a 40 percent higher rate of hospitalization from COVID-19 as compared to those aged 65 to 69. The Health Department emphasizes that the vaccine is safe, free, and highly effective. To schedule an appointment for your vaccine, call 1-866-442-5301. The Department of Health also says it hopes to begin vaccinating school teachers by March 1st and possibly earlier.

ANOTHER MOMENT OF BLACK HISTORY

Patrick Spriggs, affectionately known by friends as "Uncle Pat" was born a slave on July 28th, 1849. He worked as a field hand for 15 years until the Civil War broke out. Slaves were being called on both sides to fight, so Spriggs decided to run away and sign up with Union soldiers. He used the name Patrick Murphy. He was assigned to serve with the 42nd Regiment of U.S. Colored Troops. After being discharged from the service, Spriggs returned to Athens, where he owned a restaurant on North White Street. He died at the age of 97. It is recorded that his funeral was attended by many members of the community, both Black and White, who wished to pay their respects to "Uncle Pat," a prominent member of the Athens community.
