The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency is alerting pet and aquarium store owners and customers about the discovery of

invasive zebra mussels in products known as "moss balls." Most major pet stores have already pulled these products from shelves. The products, "Betta Buddy Marimo Ball," and similar products were imported. If you purchased any, you should



freeze the products in a plastic bag for 24 hours or boil the products for at least one minute and discard in the trash.
