COVID-19 Vaccination Plan Update

The Tennessee Department of Health has updated Tennessee's COVID-19 vaccination plan as the state continues to prioritize Tennesseans most at risk of hospitalization and death from the virus. The vaccination program has been updated to include the following groups among the Phase -c population.

- Permanent household members age 16 and older living with pregnant women
- People age 16 years and older with diagnosed diabetes
- People age 16 years and older with Down Syndrome
- People age 16 and older with progressive neuromuscular diseases such as ALS, multiple sclerosis or muscular dystrophy.

Obituaries

- Robert George Harris, age 69, of Athens, died Monday at UT Medical Center in Knoxville. He was formerly employed with Athens Stove Works and most recently with the Athens Housing Authority. Graveside services will be at 11 a.m. Friday in McMinn Memory Gardens. He will lie in state from 9 to 10:30 a.m. Friday at Ziegler Funeral Home.
- Douglas Wade Headrick, age 67, died Saturday, March 6th. He began his professional journalism career in 1975 working at the Sevier County News Record. In 1985 he was named managing editor of The Daily Post Athenian and became the paper's editor in 1987. He received several professional recognitions for his writings. Per his request, his body will be cremated and there will be a private memorial service. Companion Funeral Home of Athens is in charge of the arrangements.

HEADLINES FROM THE LEGISLATURE

- The State Historical Commission has voted 9-2 to remove the Nathan Bedford Forrest bust from the Capitol Building and move it to the Tennessee State Museum. Forrest was an early leader of the KKK.
- A bill moving through the legislature would ensure a student's right to express their beliefs on campus. This comes after Republican state senators sent a letter asking colleges and universities to prevent student athletes from kneeling during the national anthem.

A Salute to Burkett Witt

One of the best-known residents of Athens is Burkett Witt. Burkett, who is an African-American, was born in 1926, the youngest of 12 children. He attended J.L. Cook High School and then joined the U.S. Navy during World War II where he was a cook. He then returned to Athens and worked in several restaurants, where he would have to enter through the back door and

was not allowed to use the front door when customers were present. In 1949, he opened his first restaurant, "The Slop Shop." He later moved his business in 1956 to the basement of Townsend Hall at Tennessee Wesleyan. After leaving TWC, Burkett and his wife, Mildred, opened Burkett's Barbecue in Downtown Athens. He was elected to the Athens City Council in 1971 and served as Mayor from 1983-1985. He was named the Athens Man of the Year in 2009, becoming the first



African-American recipient. He was also awarded an honorary doctorate degree from Tennessee Wesleyan.
