Woman Killed in I-75 Crash

A Decatur woman was killed in a one-vehicle traffic accident on I-75 in McMinn County Monday afternoon. The Tennessee Highway Patrol reports that Surlina Easton, 49, was a passenger in a Honda Civic driven by 45-year-old Emerson Eaton of Decatur. The THP says the vehicle was traveling northbound on I-75 when the driver lost control and ran off the right side of the roadway, striking a tree. The THP says charges against Eaton are pending. The wreck happened around 12:45 p.m. Monday at mile marker 57.4.

Meet the Prom Dress Lady

Mattie Cardin is the force behind The Prom Closet at Englewood Church of God. Mattie, who is a senior at TWU, started The Prom Closet three years ago in order to provide free prom dresses to young ladies who cannot afford a dress. She said there is a big need for women "who cannot go out and spend a couple

hundred dollars on a dress that they're going to wear for a couple hours."

The first year saw 80 dresses donated. This year, there were 185 dresses. More than 50 visitors attended the 2021 Prom Closet event, with 37 dresses picked out. Mattie says The Prom Closet provides oneon-one, boutique-style consulting for young women who cannot afford a dress or other prom services, all at no cost. She says women in the church



volunteer to act almost like a consultant. They take the young ladies and go through all the different dresses. There are dresses in sizes 00 all the way to size 24, in every color, shape, size, or material you can think of, and the volunteers make them feel as beautiful as they possibly can.

Mattie graduates in December, but she plans to continue providing the prom dress service to the young ladies in the Athens area.

TODAY IN HISTORY - MARCH 24th

1820 - The American hymn writer Fanny Crosby was born. She became blind when she was only six weeks old. While attending a school for the blind, she began writing poetry. She later wrote hymns, publishing over 6,000. Many of those are still in our hymnbooks, such as "Blessed Assurance," "To God Be The Glory," "Rescue The Perishing," and "Pass Me Not, Oh Gentle Savior."

1874 - Magician and escape artist Harry Houdini was born in Hungary. He became a master of "escape," with acts in which he extricated himself from ropes, shackles, and locked containers. His most sensational feat consisted of escaping from an airtight tank that was filled with water.

1958 - Elvis Presley reported to local draft board 86 in Memphis, TN. He became US 53310761. Oddly, since Elvis was now 'government property' serving his time in the Army, Uncle Sam stood to lose an estimated \$500,000 in taxes each year that Private Presley was in the Army.

1970 - The People's Republic of China launched its first satellite, which kept transmitting a song, "The East Is Red."

1989 - The nation's worst oil spill occurred as the supertanker

Exxon Valdez ran aground on a reef in Alaska's Prince William Sound and began leaking 11 million gallons of crude.

1990 - The space shuttle Discovery blasted off from Cape Canaveral, Florida, carrying the \$1.5 billion Hubble Space Telescope.
