- A bill to increase the minimum wage to \$12 an hour in Tennessee is dead for the year...shot down in the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee.
- The Tennessee Department of Health says more than 2,000 Tennesseans died of an opioid overdose in 2019. Preliminary data for 2020 shows overdoses increased 22 percent from 2019 to 2020.
- A new report by the Porch company says Tennesseans pay the 8th highest monthly electricity bills in the nation. The report found residents in Tennessee pay an average electricity bill of \$132.33 per month, compared to the U.S. average of \$115.49.
