Details Released on Fatal Wreck

The Tennessee Highway Patrol has released the name of the man who was killed in a one-vehicle wreck last Thursday night on Highway 39 East at County Road 435. The victim was Jesse Guinn, 30, of Englewood. He was a passenger in a 1999 Ford XPL SUV driven by Dion Bryant, 32, of Englewood. The THP says Bryant lost control of the vehicle due to mechanical and weather issues. It ran off the roadway, striking a tree and landing on its side. Bryant was ejected, but Guinn was pinned inside. He was extricated, but was pronounced dead at the scene. Bryant was injured and taken by ambulance to a hospital in Knoxville. Neither occupant was wearing seat belts. The THP says charges are pending against the driver.

Saluting One More McMinn Woman

Before National Women's History Month ends, we salute one more notable woman from McMinn County. Harriel Blair sent us this article about Amanda Brown. You may not find her name in the history books, but "Miss Mandy" lives forever in the memo-

ries of the children who grew up in the J.L. Cook School community. She did not have children of her own, but considered the children of the neighborhood her children. She would open up her house for hot dog socials, which always included cookies and her famous orange Kool-aid. It was a special treat for the neighborhood children to be invited to her hours of taken on an outing by Miss Mandy. She was also a school teacher, teaching in the Lane Town Community. After teaching for a while, she started a career at Oak Ridge and remained there. She was



one of the few women from Athens to work there. She also taught Sunday School and Vacation Bible School during the summer. She was director of the shape note singing choir at Cox Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church. Amanda Brown died on September 18th, 1987.
