Last year, the city attempted to host sessions soliciting for "civic input into the city budget" but was only able to hold one session prior to the COVID-19 pandemic. Around the Volunteer State

- One of Chattanooga's most famous World War II heroes, Charles Coolidge, was buried at the Chattanooga National Cemetery on Friday. He was 99 years old. Coolidge was a Chattanooga native and received the Medal of Honor for the saving of the lives of 200 Jews in a Nazi POW camp.
- Governor Bill Lee has signed the Evelyn Boswell legislation from the General Assembly into law. It takes effect on July 1st and requires parents or guardians to report a child missing within 24 hours if the child is 12 years of age or younger. The new law is named for a 2 year old girl from Sullivan County whose mother didn't report her missing for several weeks. The child's body was discovered buried on a family farm. The mother, Megan Boswell, is now facing felony murder charges.
- Emergency crews were called to a home in Nashville last week and found two people dead and two more unconscious, unresponsive and in critical condition. An electric generator was found inside the house. Crews reported high levels of carbon monoxide in the dwelling.
- The U.S. Department of Justice has charged a Kingsport man with 13 counts in a recent indictment because of his participation in the breach and riots at the U.S. Capitol on January 6. The DOJ identified the suspect as 41-year-old Albuquerque Head.
- General Motors and LG Energy Solution have announced they will construct a huge electric vehicle battery factory in Spring Hill that will eventually create over 8,000 jobs. The factory will cost \$2.3 billion. Governor Lee said it will be the largest single investment in Tennessee's history.

TODAY IN HISTORY - APRIL 19th

1775 - The American Revolutionary War began at the Battle of Lexington, Massachusetts. Eight Minutemen were killed and 10 wounded in an exchange of musket fire with British Redcoat troops.

1897 - The first annual Boston Marathon — the first of its type in the United States — was run. John J. McDermott of New York City won.

1933 - The United States ended the "gold standard" for the dollar.

1934 - Dickie Goodman was born. He and his sidekick, Bill Buchanan, originated the novel approach to featuring bits of popular songs strung together to tell a story. Their biggest hit was "The Flying Saucer (Parts 1 & 2)" in 1956. Goodman also had a hit using the same approach in 1974 with a recording titled "Energy Crisis '74."

1995 - The Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building in Oklahoma City was destroyed by a bomb hidden in a rent-a-truck. 168 people including 19 children died in the blast.
