WEDNESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: In a busy day of earnings releases and policy announcements, equity markets were mixed but still closed near record highs. The Fed maintained its support as expected, even with an economy that policymakers acknowledged is accelerating. The 10-year Treasury yield is back above the 1.6% level, a near two-week high, helping cyclical investments outperform. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was 33,820.38, down 164.55. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was 4,183.18, down 3.54 and the NASDAQ Composite Index was 14,051.03, down 39.19.
