City Council & Other News

- ◆ The Athens City Council held its monthly meeting Tuesday evening. The big item on the agenda was passage on the first reading of the new city budget. The budget contains an 8-cent increase in the property tax rate. Council members also heard the monthly reports from the police and fire departments.
- Police Chief Cliff Couch reported there were 47 thefts in Athens in April. There were 12 burglaries, 11 motor vehicle thefts, 11 assaults, and one robbery. Police made 31 arrests for drug violations. Officers issued 206 citations for moving violations. Chief Couch reported there were 77 vehicle accidents in the city in April, with 13 injuries. There is currently one vacancy in the police department.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 165 calls in April. Five calls were to fires, 122 were calls for rescue or emergency medical service, and there were 18 false alarms. Losses for the month totaled \$56,000.
- ◆ MEDIC Regional Blood Center reports they are critically low in O Negative and O Positive blood supplies due to trauma events this week. They had one patient use over 20 O Negative units. You can help by donating blood at the MEDIC Regional office in Athens, 213 E. Washington Avenue. For info: medicblood.org
- ◆ More graduations are coming up this weekend. Fairview Christian Academy will have commencement exercises Friday, May 21st, at 6 p.m. in the church auditorium. Meigs County High School's graduation is Saturday at 9:30 a.m. on the football field.

Vaccine Ready for ages 12-15

The Tennessee Department of Health is now administering the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to children ages 12-15. The Health Department says the vaccine is safe and effective in preventing COVID-19. Up to now, the vaccine was only approved for individuals age 16 and above. Appointments can be requested online through Vaccinate.tn.gov. Health departments will also accept walk -ins. The McMinn County Health Department will be giving the vaccine on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9 to 2; Tuesday and Thursday 11 am. To 2. The vaccines will be given at the Meigs County EMA on Wednesday and Friday from 10 to 11 a.m. The Moderna and Johnson & Johnson vaccines continue to be available to individuals age 18 and older by appointment. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are two-dose vaccines, and it is important to receive the second dose for maximum protection against COVID-19.
