# **Blue Light Update**

We had a story on Tuesday's Morning Fax about the new "blue" street lights being installed throughout Athens by Athens Utilities Board. These are new LED lights that are cheaper and allow the light to be focused in a certain direction. AUB spokesman Wayne Scarbrough says a few of the new lights are very blue, almost purple. He says that is a manufacturing problem, and the maker has promised to provide new lights at no charge to replace any of the defective ones. Scarbrough says if there is a new blue light on your street that appears to be very blue or purple-ish compared to the others in your neighborhood, you should call the AUB dispatcher and they will send somebody to check it out.

### MANAGING CONCERNS ABOUT FALLS


