## **Shooting in Etowah**

An Etowah man identified as Steve Shadden, 43, has been arrested in connection with a shooting Monday morning that left

one man wounded. Etowah police responded to the report of a shooting in the area of 10th Street and Washington Avenue at 10:30 a.m. Witnesses said they saw three men standing in an alleyway before one of the men pulled out a gun. They heard a gunshot and saw people running from the scene. The victim had left the scene, but officers found him around 1:30 Monday afternoon on County Road 530. Shadden was located at a house at



930 Ohio Avenue. At first, he refused to come out, but after McMinn County deputies were called to assist, he surrendered to officers 20 minutes later. He was charged with aggravated assault, possession of a firearm during the commission of a dangerous felony, and reckless endangerment. The victim was taken to UT Medical Center for treatment, and is in stable condition. Police are still investigating the circumstances behind the shooting.

The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency is celebrating the state's Free Fishing Day this upcoming weekend. On Saturday, June 12th, residents and nonresidents of all ages may fish free in Tennessee without a license. TWRA hopes to introduce kids to the joy of fishing. Many events surrounding the day were canceled last year due to the pandemic, but will be back this year. Children ages 15 and younger may fish without a license beginning on Free Fishing Day through June 18th. TWRA stocks several thousand pounds of fish for the events.

**TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT:** U.S. equity markets finished mixed, with the DOW marginally lower and the tech-heavy NASDAQ higher. With no major directional drivers, stocks are in a holding pattern ahead of Thursday's inflation data. European stocks reached a new high as updated GDP data showed that the first-quarter contraction in the region was not as severe as initially thought. Oil prices closed above \$70 a barrel for the first time in over two years, while 10-year government bond yields declined to 1.54%. At the closing bell: DOW 34,599.82 (-30.42); S&P 500 4,227.26 (+0.74); NASDAQ 13,924.91 (+43.19).
