Grand Opening for Higher Ed Center

A grand opening ceremony for the new McMinn Higher Education Center will be held on Friday (6-11), at 10 a.m. The center is located at 2345 Denso Drive. It houses Cleveland State Community College, the UT McMinn Extension Office, and the Tennessee College of Applied Technology. Classes are already being held in the new facility. Sarah Kite reports that the UT Extension-McMinn County office is now open at the McMinn Higher Education Center, Suite 167, and the office hours are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFT CRACKDOWN

Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch says one of the biggest problems his officers are dealing with these days is catalytic converter thefts. Catalytic converters are exhaust emission devices used to reduce the toxic gases and pollutants created by automobile engines. They contain precious metals and are easy to steal. Thieves then sell them for a quick profit. However, beginning on July 1st, a new law will take effect that should help end those thefts. The new law states that any person engaged in the business of buying or selling scrap metal, including unattached catalytic converters, must give written notification to the chief of police and sheriff of each city and county in which the activity occurs. In addition, any scrap metal dealer who buys a catalytic converter must obtain a copy of the seller's drivers license or vehicle registration.
