


Remembering the COVID Victims

The latest numbers from the Tennessee Department of Health show 102 people have died in McMinn County over the last

year and a half from COVID-19. Virtually everyone has been impacted. Everyone knows someone who died from the virus, either a family member, a co-worker, or a friend. This coming Sunday, June 27th, the Athens Ministerial Association will hold a COVID-19 Memorial Service to honor and remember the lives lost to the pandemic in McMinn County. The service will be held at 7 p.m. at Market Pavilion in Downtown Athens. Everyone is invited to attend the brief
