# **New Laws Take Effect July 1st**

Several new laws take effect in Tennessee effective July 1st:

- Beginning July 1st, most law-abiding Tennesseans can carry a firearm either open or concealed without a permit.
- Volunteer firefighters will receive a \$600 annual payment upon completion of at least 30 hours of training.
- A felon who uses a firearm while committing a crime will have to serve 85% of the sentence, up from the current 30%.
- A person who murders a first responder will be punished as a terrorist with a sentence of death or life without parole.
- A new law provides for a \$20,000 reward for information leading to the arrest of any individual who kills a law enforcement officer in the line of duty.
- The Tennessee Business Fairness Act takes effect. The measure puts all businesses on the same playing field during a pandemic so small businesses are not forced to close while their bigger competitors stay open.
- A law goes into effect that protects civilian reemployment rights for Tennessee National Guard members upon completion of State Active Duty service.

# Gospel Music Flashback

June 30th, 1954, is known as one of the most important dates in Southern Gospel music. A plane crash claimed the lives of two members of the Blackwood Brothers Quartet and devastated the popular group. The Blackwood Brothers were in Clanton, Alabama, to sing with the Statesmen at the Peach Festival. They had recently purchased an airplane to travel from city to city. R.W. Blackwood and the group's bass singer, Bill Lyles,

decided to take plane were censed pilots. It crashed on landing, killing both men. After the James crash, Blackwood told Statesmen's Hovie Lister he



would never sing again. However, in 1956 the group reorganized with the famous bass singer J.D. Sumner. The Blackwood Brothers released over 200 albums and sold over 50 million records. Among their best-known songs were "Learning to Lean" and "Give The World A Smile." The photo shows Lyles and R.W. Blackwood at the controls of their plane.

**1859 -** French acrobat Blondin crossed Niagara Falls on a tight-

rope as 5,000 spectators watched.

1917 - Singer Lena Horne was born. Her biggest hit record was "Stormy Weather." Lena Horne died May 9<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

1921 - Documents were signed forming the Radio Corporation of America, better known as RCA. RCA soon rivaled its main competitor, General Electric (GE).

1936 - The Pulitzer Prize-winning novel "Gone With The Wind" was published. The book by Margaret Mitchell was made into the

was published. The book by Margaret Mitchell was made into the longest film of its day—220 minutes. The story is set in Atlanta in the Civil War days and has remained popular throughout the years. The movie starred Clark Gable as Rhett Butler, Vivian Leigh, and Olivia de Haviland, among others, including Butterfly McQueen.

1953 - The first Corvette rolled off the Chevrolet assembly line in

Flint, MI. That early 'Vette sold for \$3,250.

1962 - Los Angeles Dodger's star Sandy Koufax pitched his first no-hitter in a game with the New York Mets. Koufax would toss

three more no-hit games before retiring in 1966. **1971 -** The 26th Amendment to the Constitution, lowering the minimum voting age to 18, was ratified as Ohio became the 38th state to approve it.

1994 - The U.S. Figure Skating Association stripped Tonya Harding of the national championship and banned her from the organization for life for an attack on rival Nancy Kerrigan.
