Fatality On the Hiwassee River

A 15-year-old boy from Crossville drowned on the Hiwassee River Friday afternoon. The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency responded to a call just before 4:45 p.m. regarding an overturned kayak on the Hiwassee River in the Quinn Springs area in Polk County. The TWRA says a group of nine adults and 11 juveniles had left in kayaks and tubes on a point-to-point trip along the Hiwassee River. The 15-year-old was last seen behind the group on a sit-on-top kayak. Members of the group discovered the boy down river, unresponsive and away from his kayak, and called for assistance. TWRA officers, Polk County EMS, the rescue squad, and the Polk County Sheriff's office responded. The male was transported and declared deceased at Starr Regional Medical Center in Etowah. The kayak was later found against a large, downed tree. The victim was transported to UT Medical Center for an autopsy.

Local Cemetery History

Local historian and author, Patsy Duckworth, has written another book titled "Legacies of Cedar Grove Cemetery Through 1939."

The book is about the lives of people buried at Cedar Grove Cemetery, which includes most of the early founders of Athens. The earliest grave dates back to 1829 and ends with a survey taken in 1939 by the WPA Historical Records Division. Patsy says the cemetery was originally called the "Athens Burying Ground." The earliest person to have been buried at Cedar Grove was Dr. Benjamin Stout from Rhea County. Dr. J.L. Cook, who started the Athens Academy, a school for blacks, is buried there. Robert Fisher is also buried at Cedar



Grove. He was the first Athenian to ride in an airplane and owned the first car in Athens. He was an industrialist who built the Grandview Hotel and founded Athens Stove Works.
