
Meigs Pair Steals Church Money

A small Meigs County church that was damaged by an earth-

quake and later was hit by fire back in 2019 is back in the news after half of its small congregation was indicted on charges of stealing. The Tennessee Comptroller's Office says a grand jury indicted Carolyn Mullins and her son, Larry, for theft over \$60,000. Investigators say the pair stole more than \$83,000 from Peakland Baptist Church, which has only four members. In 2019, the church was destroyed by fire, reportedly due to a faulty heater. The Comptroller's Office says the church decided to rebuild with insurance money, but work was never completed due to a lack of funds. Larry Mullins was the church treasurer and his mother was the assistant treasurer. They were



the only people authorized to sign checks. Investigators say the Mullins' wrote church checks for cash to themselves and bought gift cards, cigarettes, a ring, and clothing from Wal-Mart. The Mullins' transferred \$12,221.31 back to the church. However, a balance of \$71,489.51 is still owed to the church. Comptroller Jason Mumpower says churches should have someone other than the treasurer reconcile the monthly bank statements and review financial activity.

He played collegiate football and golf at Carson Newman College. In 1969, he entered the US Army, serving a combat tour in Vietnam in 1970. In 1979, he took his first head coaching job at Copper Basin High School. In 1983, he became the head football coach at McMinn County High School, where he coached for 19 years. After a brief retirement, Mullinax returned to coaching at Armuchee High School in Rome, Georgia. He returned to Tennessee in 2012 as head coach at Tellico Plains High School. A memorial service will be conducted at 2 p.m. Friday at Smith Funeral Home, with visitation on Thursday from 4 to 8 p.m. and again on Friday from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.
