4-Vehicle Crash Blocks I-75 NB

Northbound traffic on I-75 in McMinn County was blocked for hours on Wednesday as a result of a traffic accident involving four vehicles, including two tractor trailer rigs and a minivan, near mile marker 45. The driver of the mininvan, William Al Jackson, Sr., age 73, of Knoxville, was killed in the wreck. State Trooper Travis Ryans says northbound traffic was diverted off the interstate at the Riceville exit, exit 42. As a result, there was bumper-to-bumper traffic on U.S. 11 from Riceville to Athens. 

5 STARS FOR STARR REGIONAL HEALTH & REHAB

Starr Regional Health & Rehabilitation in Etowah has been awarded five stars in the Nursing Home Five Star Quality Rating System published on the Nursing Home Compare website. Nursing homes with five stars are considered to have exceeded average quality on a consistent basis. Starr's five-star rating places the facility in the top 22 percent of all nursing homes in the state. Only 68 of the 312 nursing homes in Tennessee rated received five stars.

The Case of the Missing Cameras

There will be a called meeting of the Athens City Council for 5 p.m. next Tuesday, Aug. 10th. One item likely to be discussed is the case of two missing "Nest" cameras which mysteriously disappeared from the police department and then mysteriously reappeared. One of the cameras was kept locked up in the "Sergeant's Closet." The other had been installed in the police lobby. Detective Blake Witt says City Manager Seth Sumner had asked for the cameras and they were turned over to him. Some time later, Police Chief Cliff Couch asked Sumner for the cameras, and Sumner said Detective Witt was wrong and that he did not "take possession of the cameras." Chief Couch then bought a Trail camera with his own money and installed it in the Sergeant's Closet. When he checked the camera later, it had recorded a member of the police department apparently turning it off, and then turning it back on 60 minutes later. Couch says it is very likely that the officer deactivated the trail camera, put the Nest cam back in the closet, and then reactivated the trail cam. The police officer denied that, saying he had entered the closet looking for an evidence canister. Chief Couch says he did not believe the officer's story and he should have been disciplined or terminated for tampering with the trail cam. However, Couch says only Sumner has the authority to make those decisions. Meantime, Detective Witt discovered the other Nest camera in his computer bag. Chief Couch informed DA Steve Crump about what had taken place, but did not ask for an investigation at this point.
