#### **♦** BIG CHANGES FOR AREA NEWSPAPERS

- The Chattanooga Times Free Press will discontinue its print editions by next June, except for Sundays. Apple iPads will be provided to all home-delivery subscribers, and agents from the paper will teach readers how to use them if necessary.
- The Daily Post-Athenian announced that it will stop delivering the paper to homes and businesses effective October 12th. Instead, the paper will be delivered by the USPS. The DPA will be published on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and subscribers will receive the paper with their regular mail.

## Is Unclaimed Money Waiting for You?

The Tennessee Department of Treasury currently has \$1.2 billion in unclaimed property, primarily money. This is money that has been turned over to the State by businesses and organizations unable to locate the owners. This includes intangible assets such as utility or business refunds, unclaimed wages, credit balances for overpayments, gift certificates, securities, bank accounts, etc. The Treasury Department utilizes various methods to locate owners of unclaimed property, including mailing letters to the address provided when the property was turned over from the business (holder), and sending letters to employers of potential claimants whose Social Security number has been matched with records from the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development. Last year, 188,704 properties totaling about \$60 million were returned by the Unclaimed Property Division to the owners or their heirs, local governments, and reciprocal states. There is never a fee to claim your missing money in Tennessee, nor is there a timeframe to claim it. Anyone can see if they are owed any missing money by searching their name at ClaimitTN.gov. You may file a claim online if you find unclaimed property belonging to you or your deceased family members. The Treasury Department recommends searching for common misspellings of your name and address as well, since that may be why the business was unable to return the money to you initially. The unclaimed money ranges from under \$25 to fairly large amounts.
