Confirming Some Rumors

Rumors have been swirling for months about new businesses which may or may not be planning to locate in Athens. The rumors went into high gear earlier this year with the closing of Staples and Plaza Electronics' move to the Staples building. Signs have also been posted on Dennis Street listing names of some retailers that may be locating there in a proposed development.

Some of those rumors were confirmed at the Athens City Council's study session this week. The City of Athens hired a company called Retail Strategies to help attract retail development. John Ruzic with Retail Strategies updated council members. He confirmed that the discount grocer, Aldi, has signed a lease and is expected to be open in the former Plaza Electronics space in Belk Plaza within two years.

Ruzic also said several nationally-known retailers have signed leases to locate in the Athens Marketplace development planned for Dennis Street. He says leases have been signed for clothing retailers Ross and Marshalls and Five Below. Ruzic says construction contracts are currently out for bid. He also told the council members that the developers of Athens Marketplace are negotiating with shoe, beauty, and pet supply retailers in hopes of getting them to make a commitment to locate in the development.

At this point, there is no firm target date for Athens Marketplace to open. Ruzic says the project has been delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
