City Council Update

- The Athens City Council held its monthly meeting Tuesday evening. Among other things, Larry W. Saunders was awarded the VIVID (Very Important Volunteer Individual) Award. Saunders founded the Voice of Deliverance Ministry Church of God in Christ in Athens, and has served as pastor for the past 20 years. He also operated a barber shop and has counseled many young men in the Athens area over the years, inspiring them to become upright citizens of Athens. He also is the owner of Big Daddy's BBQ Shack.
- Chief Cliff Couch issued the police report for August. It shows there were 59 thefts, 18 assaults, 14 burglaries, 9 motor vehicle thefts, and 5 sex offenses. There were also 24 drug cases. Athens police made 118 arrests in August. Officers issued 299 citations for moving violations. There were 53 traffic accidents in Athens in August, with one fatality and 8 injuries. Chief Couch says there are currently three vacancies in the Police Department.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 200 incidents in August. Of those, 135 were rescue and emergency medical service calls. There were seven fires and 32 false alarms. Losses from fires in August totaled \$180,000.
- No date or location has been chosen for the continuation of the special called meeting for the City Council to investigate issues involving City Manager C. Seth Sumner and Police Chief Couch. The last session was cancelled due to COVID.

OCTOBER POWER RATE TO DROP

The power rate from Athens Utilities Board for the coming month of October will decrease again, reaching a level just below nine cents. The local rate will move from the current \$0.09178 down to \$0.08989 per kilowatt hour as "transition rates" take effect and replace the summer rate. The transition rate season will be in effect for the months of October and November.
