Quadruple Murder In McMinn

Fatal Shooting (Continued)

Two people are in custody after a quadruple murder that occurred Saturday morning at a residence on County Road 60 west of Riceville. McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy says officers responded to the residence around 8 a.m. on a report of a shooting involving multiple people. As they arrived, they encountered two witnesses who had escaped the shooting. At the residence, deputies found four people--one adult male and three adult females--dead from gunshot wounds. Sheriff Guy says it appears there were six people present at the residence when a male and a female arrived.



Guy says there was a dispute between the female suspect and the male victim over their 10-month-old child. At some point, the dispute turned violent and the four victims were shot. One witness escaped and the other pretended to be injured and survived. The suspects then took the child and left the scene. The victims of the shooting were identified as Trevon Hall, 36, Skylar Hawn, 24, Jesse Dupree, 40, and Brandi Harris, 39. The suspects were identified as Charles D. Smith, 38, of Etowah and Jazzmine J. Hall, 27, of County Rd. 60, Athens. They were taken into custody several hours later at a residence just inside Polk County in a SWAT operation conducted by the McMinn County Sheriff's Office SWAT team with the assistance of the Polk County Sheriff's Office, the 10th District Drug Task Force, and U.S. Marshals. The 10-month-old child was recovered safe and released to the custody of the Department of Children's Services. Both Smith and Hall have been charged with four counts of premeditated murder.

Athens Man Charged In Murder

There was a homicide in the City of Athens Saturday night. Police

Chief Cliff Couch says officers responded to a house on View Street around 11 p.m. When they arrived, they found Steve McKeehan, age 39, dead at the scene. They arrested James Ramey, age 43, on charges of 2nd Degree murder. Chief Couch says the investigation showed that the two men had gotten into an argument at Ramey's house at 1715



View Street when Ramey allegedly struck McKeehan with a machete.
