

Allegations of Teacher Abuse

Etowah City School Director Mike Frazier says a special education teacher has been suspended without pay after allegations of abusing two students. Dr. Frazier says he learned of an alleged incident on Sept. 17th and reported the incident to the TN Dept. of Children's Services and the Etowah Police Department. The police report says the teacher allegedly threw footballs and dodge balls at the students with enough force to make them cry. One of the students also had bruises on her arms. The teacher also allegedly yelled at and pushed students when they misbehaved. Dr. Frazier says at this point the teacher is not facing any criminal charges. The teacher is indentified as 42-year-old John Lawson.

Pfizer Boosters Are Ready

The Tennessee Department of Health is now offering booster doses of COVID vaccine to certain populations. A single booster dose of the Pfizer vaccine can be administered to:

- People 65 and older and residents in long-term care settings

- People 50-64 with underlying medical conditions

- People 18-49 with underlying medical conditions based on risks and individual benefits

- People 18-64 who are at increased risk for COVID exposure and transmission because of occupational or institutional setting based on their individual benefits and risks.

In all cases, the booster will be given at least 6 months after your initial first and second vaccinations. Local health departments will be giving the shots, and no appointment is needed.
