Make the switch to SouthEast Bank Athens 1878 S. Congress Parkway *APY= annual percentage yield. Rates subject to change after account opening. APYs are accurate as of 06/07/2021. To earn Bonus Rate, each month the account must be enrolled in eStatements and post and clear at least 15 debit transactions of \$1 or more. If all qualifications are met during the statement cycle, a bonus rate of 2.01% APY on balances of up to \$20,000 and .20% APY on balances over \$20,000 will be credited.
