Bell Not Seeking Re-election

State Senator Mike Bell of Riceville says he will not be a candidate for re-election in 2022. Bell was first elected to the House of Representatives in 2006 before moving to the State Senate in

2010 where he represents McMinn, Monroe, Bradley, Meigs, and Polk counties.

Bell is currently the chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. He says it has been the highest honor of his life to serve in the Tennessee General Assembly. However, he says just as he knew it was time for him to run for office in 2006, he feels it is now time



to move to the next chapter of his life and pass the leadership mantle for his district to a new state senator.

During his legislative tenure, Senator Bell has been a strong advocate of Second Amendment rights, including sponsoring the law establishing the right to carry a firearm without a permit. He also sponsored several laws protecting unborn children, laws strengthening penalties for human trafficking, and bills removing unfair restrictions concerning the eligibility of home school students for Tennessee's lottery scholarships.

Bell will continue to serve until a new state senator is elected in the regular general election on November 8th, 2022.


