Athens City Council Meets

The Athens City Council held its monthly meeting Tuesday night, and the members heard reports on police and fire department activity for November.

- Interim Police Chief Freddy Schultz reported there were 48 thefts in November, 20 assaults, 5 motor vehicle thefts. 3 burglaries, and 2 sex offenses. Officers issued 289 citations for moving violations. (The number of citations for moving violations has increased sharply, now standing at 2653 for the year. That's up from 1049 through November of 2020) There were 90 traffic accidents in the city in November with 10 injuries. There are currently six vacancies in the police department.
- Fire Chief Brandon Ainsworth reported that firefighters responded to 161 calls during November. Most of them, 119, were for rescue and emergency medical service. There were six fires, and 21 false alarms. The fire calls involved two dumpsters, two vehicle fires, one grass fire, and one cooking fire, with the fire confined to the container. There was also one gas leak.
