One day after being spotted in McMinn County, a Georgia murder suspect has been captured in Scott County. Brian Wiseman was taken into custody at a vacant house Monday night. Wiseman was seen Sunday in Englewood, and later that day he was spotted in Madisonville.

CR 902 MAN DESCRIBES ESCAPE FROM FIRE The occupant of the house that was destroyed by fire on County Road 902 near Etowah last Thursday morning says he is thankful to have escaped with his life. Corey Clark, 30, says he got home from his job at Denso early that morning and went to bed, with his three dogs in the bedroom with him. At some point, he heard his smoke detector beeping, like it does when the batteries need to be changed. Finally, he got up to remove the batteries. When he opened the bedroom door, he discovered the house was on fire. He barely managed to get out, along with his dogs, but the house was destroyed. Corey suffered minor smoke inhalation and received a minor burn on the top of his head. Everything he owned was destroyed, right down to things like photographs, keepsakes, and important papers like his drivers license and Social Security card. Fortunately, he had insurance on both the house and contents, so the insurance company is putting him up in a hotel temporarily. He says friends and members of his church have donated tons of clothing. He wants to say thank you to everyone who has helped him out, and he asks for your prayers.

SOCIAL SECURITY CHECKS TO INCREASE

Millions of Americans on Social Security will soon have a little more money in their pocket. Retirees will get a 5.9% increase in benefits for 2022. That's the highest cost-of-living adjustment in nearly 40 years. The increase in benefits is due to inflation and supply chain issues which have driven up the cost of goods, including food and gas. The average retired worker will receive an additional \$92 per month.
