Therefore, the Athens Area Ministerial Association will be offering an online service again this year. #### **CRACKER BARREL ORDERED TO PAY MILLIONS**

A jury in Marion County has ordered the Cracker Barrel restaurant chain to pay a man millions of dollars after it ruled the company was at fault when the customer was served something besides the glass of water he had ordered. William Cronnon says he was served what he thought was a glass of water while eating lunch at a Cracker Barrel in Marion County in 2014. The glass actually contained a cleaning chemical known as Eco-San. The ingestion caused serious physical injuries to Cronnon, burning his mouth and esophagus. The original lawsuit asked Cracker Barrel to pay Cronnon \$150,000 in damages. But the jury wound up awarding him \$3.6 million in non-economic damages and \$570,000 in economic damages.

#### **TODAY IN HISTORY - JAN 14th**

**1741** - Benedict Arnold, the American Revolutionary War general and traitor, was born. Arnold was in command of West Point in 1780 and devised a scheme to surrender the fort to the British. The plan was exposed before it could take place. Arnold escaped to New York City, where he became a general in the British army.

**1914** - Henry Ford began the assembly-line method of building cars on this date. The first car to roll off the line was the famous "Model T" Ford.

**1938** - Singer Jack Jones was born. Among his hit records: "Dear Heart" and "Lollipops and Roses."

**1954** - Marilyn Monroe married baseball great, Joe Di-Maggio. The marriage lasted nine months. After her death (in 1962), DiMaggio had red roses delivered to her crypt two to three times a week for some twenty years.

**2008** - Republican Bobby Jindal, the first elected Indian-American governor in the United States, took office in Louisiana.
