### **Memories of Dr. King**

With each passing year, fewer people remain alive who actually knew Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., whose birthday we celebrate today. One of those is your Morning Fax editor, Bob Ketchersid. Here are some of his recollections:

"I first met Dr. King in early 1966 shortly after I went to work at WSB Radio in Atlanta as a reporter. I, of course, had heard of Dr. King and knew that his home was in Atlanta. The first time I met him was on a Sunday afternoon when I covered a speech Dr. King made at an Atlanta church. Afterward, I went up to retrieve my microphone, and introduced myself to Dr. King. By that time, he was world-renowned. He had won the Nobel Peace Prize, had made his famous "I have a dream" speech in Washington, and had led numerous non-violent demonstrations. I was surprised about how short he was. But I was also surprised at how friendly he was. He told me he listened to the news on WSB and treated me like we were old friends. In the next couple of years, I interviewed him many times. I would often meet him at the airport when he returned from Alabama or some other place where he had been leading protests. I remember going to his modest frame home on a tree-lined residential street on Atlanta's west side one Sunday afternoon to record a speech he was going to give by telephone to some group. I noticed there were three telephones on his desk. When he stepped out of the room for a moment, I quickly wrote down those numbers. I also covered the funeral and funeral procession in Atlanta following his assassination. My grandchildren are amazed that I actually knew Dr. King!"
