

- A new bill has been introduced by Tennessee lawmakers that would give older students more time to sleep by delaying the start time in public schools. If passed, public Middle School and High School students could be starting school at a later time. The bill would have High School students start the day no earlier than 8:30 am and Middle School students no earlier than 8:00 am. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommended more sleep for High School students and said it was healthier for them.
- The 3M Company announced that they will invest approximately \$470 million to expand their production facilities in Clinton and will create around 600 new jobs by 2025. According to the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development, the company plans to invest in two of its fast-growing product lines: FiltreteTM air filters and CommandTM adhesive strips. Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee said that "3M's decision to expand in Tennessee is a testament to our state's pro-business climate and skilled workforce."
