SCHOOL BOARD REMOVES HOLOCAUST BOOK

The McMinn County Board of Education has voted unanimously to remove a book about the holocaust from the school curriculum. The vote was held during a called meeting on January 10th. Board members said the graphic novel called "Maus" by Art Spiegellman has inappropriate language and graphic depictions. After discussing options like redacting portions of the book if given by permission by the author or replacing the book with another book about the holocaust, board members decided to remove the book altogether. In 1992, "Maus" became the first graphic novel to win a Pulitzer Prize. School board members said the book was not removed because it dealt with the holocaust, but because of the graphic language in the book.
