✓ The Athens Parks and Recreation Department is accepting registrations now through Thursday, March 3rd, for the 2022 McMinn County Little League and Wittle Weague programs. Little League Baseball is for boys and girls ages 4 to 12 and Wittle Weague baseball if for boys and girls ages three and four. The fee for Little League is \$75 per player, which includes a jersey, pants, hat, belt, socks, and secondary medical insurance. The Wittle Weague fee is \$25 per player, which includes a T-shirt, jersey, and secondary medical insurance. All games will be played at the Athens Regional Park, and admission is free. Games will be played on weekdays and on Saturdays. You can register at the Recreation office. A copy of each player's birth certificate is required for Little League and must be on file prior to participation. Volunteers are needed for coaches and team parents. Skeletal Remains Identified

Skeletal remains found last year in a rural area off County Road 782 in McMinn County have been identified as a man reported missing in November. In September 2021, a vehicle registered to Darrell Foster was located on some property belonging to his brother, Phillip Mooney, on County Road 782. Mooney reported to the McMinn Sheriff's Office that his brother had a history of drug use but he had not seen him in a while. Mooney said he was going to have the vehicle removed from the property. On November 12, Amber Foster, daughter of Darrell Foster, contacted the Sheriff's Office to report her father as missing, and that she had last spoken to him in June or July of 2021. On February 8 of this year, Sheriff's investigators spoke with Mr. Foster's sister, Denise Baker, who said their mother had passed away in October, 2021 but still no one had seen or heard from Mr. Foster. After speaking with each other, the family members believed that Mr. Foster was probably deceased in some unknown location due to his past drug issues. On December 14th, Sheriff's detectives obtained permission and organized a search of the property on County Road 782 where Mr. Foster's vehicle had previously been located. During the search, a campsite was located, along with some personal items belonging to Mr. Foster. The search progressed further until detectives located human remains in the area of the campsite, and contacted the UT Forensic Center, which responded and collected the remains. On Wednesday, February 16th, the Sheriff's Office was contacted by the UT Forensics Center that advised the remains were matched against medical records and were positively identified as those of Darrell Foster. Mr. Foster's family was notified of the results by McMinn Sheriff's Detectives. The investigation is ongoing as to a cause of death, but currently nothing indicates that foul play was involved.
