✓ On March 1st, all unpaid 2021 city property taxes will become delinquent, with a penalty added at the rate of one and one-half percent per month for each month taxes are delinquent until paid. Citizens of Athens may avoid this penalty by paying 2021 property taxes prior to March 1, 2022. After March 1st, all unpaid 2020 city property taxes must be filed in Chancery Court for collection. Court cost, additional penalties, and legal costs may be avoided by paying 2020 property taxes prior to March 1, 2022.

✓ McMinn County Trustee Phil Tuggle reminds taxpayers that Monday, February 28th, is the last day to pay county property taxes before interest and penalty must be added. The Trustee's Office will be open 8:30 a.m. to 12 noon this Saturday, and from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. this Friday and Monday for those who want to avoid the penalty and interest.
