Detective Receives Recognition

Gershwin Jackson, age 42, of Ten Mile, died Sunday near Sand Island on Watts Bar Lake. Jackson, along with two other men, had been camping and left their campground in a canoe. Winds were at 15 to 20 miles per hour and reports from the scene indicated that waves were white capping at the time. The water temperature was

believed to be about 54 The canoe degrees. overturned and the three men, who were all wearing life jackets, attempted to swim to shore. Α Tennessee Wildlife Resources Officer and several bystanders found the three men and pulled them out of the water. Two were suffering from hypothermia and Jackson was unresponsive. He was pronounced dead and was taken to




the Rhea County Medical Examiner's Office. The other two men, who have not been identified, were treated at the scene. The agencies that participated in the rescue were Meigs County Fire and Rescue, Meigs County Emergency Medical Services, Meigs County Sheriff's Office and the Rhea County Emergency Medical Services. More Info on License Plates

Melinda King, the McMinn County Clerk, responded to our article published in Monday's Morning Fax about the new 2022 Tennessee License Plate. Here are her comments:

When we first started giving out the new tags in January, we were given a small number of the "In God We Trust" plates. The state gave us a number based on what had been sold and/or renewed the previous year. Because of that, we weren't able to offer them to everyone for a couple of weeks, and until we started a steady supply, we were running out. (I think one clerk did charge the \$6 to a customer early on because she didn't know we weren't charging to replace the plain tag).

Here's the current situation since around the end of January and first of February:

Everyone that comes in that is renewing a class 1000/1001 or is registering a vehicle for the first time is asked if they want the plain or the "In God We Trust" tag.

If a customer was not able to get the "In God We Trust" tag and wants to swap out for one (within a reasonable amount of time), they are not charged.
