APD Arrests Two in Drug Bust

Athens Police conducted a narcotics investigation this past Tuesday which led to a search warrant being executed at the Days Inn on Decatur Pike. During the search, officers came into contact with a male and a female occupying a hotel room where officers and agents located several narcotics, cash, a firearm and drug paraphernalia. The occupants were identified as Clifton Hall, age 34, of Knoxville and Ashley Arnwine, age 19, of Athens. Hall has been charged with Possession of Schedule II Fentanyl with intent to sell; Possession of Schedule II Methamphetamine with intent to sell; Possession of Schedule II Cocaine with intent to sell; Possession of Ecstasy with intent to sell; Possession of Schedule VI with intent to sell; Possession of a weapon by a convicted felon and Possession of a weapon during the commission of a felony. Arnwine was issued a citation for possession of drug paraphernalia and released. The investigation was held with the cooperation of the Tennessee Bureau of Investigations (TBI) Drug Unit and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF).
