Agriculture Dept. Closes Store

The Piggly Wiggly Grocery Store in Decatur has been temporarily closed by the Tennessee Department of Agriculture due to a rodent infestation. A shopper filed a complaint on February 22nd with the TDA and a supervisor inspected the store the next day. While the inspector was there, rodent activity was observed and as a result, a short-term plan to keep the store open was discussed between the Tennessee Department of Agriculture and the Piggly Wiggly owner and managers. The plan said that affected food items would have to be removed from the store. Also, cleaning and sanitizing parts of the store would be required. A follow-up visit by the inspector was done on Monday, March 7th and the TDA found that rodent activity was still present. At that point a Notice of Closure was issued. The owner must now submit a corrective action plan on taking care of the rodents. Once the plan is approved by the TDA, a timeline to reopen the store will be put in place. The store may be subject to financial penalties if it fails to comply.

A company in Lewisburg, *Tennessee Technical Coatings Corp.*, is voluntarily recalling 1-gallon containers of hand sanitizer that were sold between April 2020 and August 2020. The Food and Drug Administration found that the product contained methanol, which could cause headache, blurred vision, coma, seizures, permanent blindness, damage to the central nervous system or death.

Equities finished lower. After U.S. stocks logged their best daily gain on Wednesday, since June of 2020, the mood shifted back toward caution on Thursday. Growth investments lagged value as interest rates remained a headwind to areas like technology stocks. Consumer prices show inflation remains at a 40-year high. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 112.18 to 33,174.07. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 18.36 to 4,259.52, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 125.58 to 13,129.96.
