Water Improvements Announced

Governor Bill Lee and Commissioner David Salyers of the Tennessee Department of Environment and conservation (TDEC) announced two loans totaling \$2,918,900 for the Hiwassee Utilities Commission-Bradley County and Hiwassee Utilities Commission-McMinn County to improve water infrastructure. Each of the loans is for \$1,459,450.

The loans are a way to make water infrastructure more affordable in local communities across Tennessee. Governor Lee said "We are glad to assist both Bradley and McMinn counties and look forward to the improvements that will result from this program."

According to Salyers, "This assistance will help make vital infrastructure happen, and we are glad these loans can be made available." The Hiwassee Utilities Commission's loans comes from the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Program which addresses improvements to the water treatment system and has a 20-year term at .81 percent interest.

MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: Equity markets started the week with a decline. Early morning optimism around the Russian and Ukrainian talks reversed. Chinese tech stocks came under pressure amid concerns that China's ties with Russia introduce some regulatory risk. The 10-year Treasury yield climbed to 2.14%.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 1.05 to 32,945.24. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 31.20 to 4,173.11, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 262.59 points to 12,581.22.

Officer-Involved Shooting in Madisonville

At the request of 10th District Attorney General Steve Crump, TBI agents are investigating the circumstances leading to an officer-involved shooting that occurred on Saturday in Monroe County. Preliminary information indicates that late Saturday night, deputies with the Monroe County Sheriff's Office were pursuing a subject believed to be involved in a shooting that occurred earlier in the evening. After the subject's vehicle became disabled, he ran from the area toward the 600 block of Gudger Road in Madisonville. Reports from the scene indicate that, a short time later, a deputy encountered the subject, who brandished a handgun. The deputy fired his service weapon, striking the man. He was transported to a Knoxville hospital for treatment. No officers were injured during the incident.

TBI agents continue to work to independently determine the series of events leading to the shooting, including collecting evidence and conducting interviews. Throughout the process, investigative findings will be shared with the District Attorney General for his review and consideration. The TBI acts solely as fact-finders in its cases and does not determine whether the actions of an officer were justified in these types of matters; that decision rests with the District Attorney General requesting TBI's involvement

The TBI does not identify the officers involved in these types of incidents and instead refers questions of that nature to the respective department to answer as it sees fit.
