
#### Love Thy Neighbor Project

## Wednesday's Market Report

After four consecutive days of gains, U.S. stocks took a breather. Energy prices rose and optimism around the ceasefire talks between Russia and Ukraine faded. WTI oil rose to \$107 after it fell below \$100 yesterday. The 10-year Treasury yield declined to 2.35%. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 65.38 to 35,228.81. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 29.15 to 4,602.45, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 177.36 to 14,442.28.
