Markets closed sharply lower, as a drop in energy prices failed to spur a broader market rally. Crude oil moved notably lower, with WTI down by over 6%, to \$101 levels. Treasury bond yields have consolidated, after moving sharply higher earlier in the month. The U.S. 10-year yield is down to 2.32%.

At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 550.46 to 34,678.35. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 72.04 to 4,530.41, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 221.76 to 14,220.52.


