MONDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. equities finished modestly higher. Global markets were generally higher while commodities finished mostly to the upside, including gains in oil and gold prices. Interest rates were up slightly with 10-year Treasury yields holding just above the 2.4% level.

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 103.61 to 34,921.88. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was up 36.78 to 4,582.64, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was up 271.05 to 14,532.55.
