TUESDAY'S MARKET REPORT: U.S. stocks ended lower in a choppy session after data showed that inflation is running at its highest since 1981. The yield on the 10-year Treasury dropped to 2.724%. A rebound by oil futures also accelerated a jump of 6.7% to close at \$100.60 a barrel At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was down 87.72 to 34,220.36. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 15.08 to 4,397.45, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 40.38 to 13,371.57.
