1509 - England's King Henry VII died; he was succeeded by his 17-year-old son, Henry VIII.

1789 - John Adams was sworn in as the first vice president of the United States.

1836 - An army of Texans led by Sam Houston defeated the Mexicans at San Jacinto, assuring Texas independence. **1910 -** Author Samuel Langhorne Clemens, better known

as Mark Twain, died in Redding, Connecticut, at age 74. **1918 -** Manfred von Richthofen, 25, the German ace known as the "Red Baron" who was believed to have downed 80 enemy aircraft during World War I, was himself shot down and killed while in action over France.

1930 - Fire broke out inside the overcrowded Ohio Penitentiary in Columbus, killing 332 inmates.

U.S. equities were mixed. Netflix fell over 20% on disappointing subscriber growth and dragged down the NASDAQ. Oil traded flat at around \$102.50. Bond yields pulled back. The U.S. 10-year yield closed around 2.85%. At the closing bell, The Dow Jones Industrial Average was up 249.59 to 35,160.79. The Standard & Poor's 500 Index was down 2.76 to 4,459.45, and the NASDAQ Composite Index was down 166.59 to 13,453.07.
