Local and State News

- ◆ Former Athens Police Chief Cliff Couch has filed a lawsuit in U.S. District Court in Chattanooga claiming violations of his First Amendment rights and accuses Athens City Manager, C. Seth Sumner of retaliating against him for speaking out about activities involving the city manager. The six-count federal complaint comes from a so-called feud between Couch and Sumner over the police chief's claims that Sumner interfered with his authority as chief, pressured him to investigate an elected city official, retaliated against him for going to other elected officials with suspicions about Sumner and that Sumner fired him in retaliation. Couch was fired in October of 2021 by Sumner after a special City Council meeting into ongoing problems between the two city officials. Couch is seeking \$2 million in compensatory and punitive damages. The award could be tripled to \$6 million due to certain guidelines that would apply if Couch wins the case.
- ♦ A 43-year-old Cleveland woman was killed in a wreck Wednesday on Interstate 75 in McMinn County. The Tennessee Highway Patrol said a Texas truck driver was stopped in the left lane at mile marker 52 NB due to TDOT construction. According to the THP's report, Patricia Graves driving a Nissan Versa failed to stop for traffic, and hit the truck in the rear. She was pronounced dead on the scene.
- ◆ Governor Bill Lee called off the execution of a Tennessee inmate after an "oversight" in lethal injection preparation. Nearly an hour before Oscar Smith, 72, was scheduled to be executed (Thursday, April 21), the governor's officer released the following statement: "Due to an oversight in preparation for lethal injection, the scheduled execution of Oscar Smith will not move forward tonight. I am granting a temporary reprieve while we address Tennessee Department of Correction protocol. Further details will be released when they are available".
